<p>2. Matters arising Forester Sub-committee – JP has emailed CPC for clarification on many points following their last council meeting and has requested a meeting with them. It was suggested that Molash residents would be surveyed to gain a level of interest in the magazine. Noticeboards - No movement Calendar – A donation of £360 will be sent to MacMillan Nurses. Planning –</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Foodari – Report from SD via email – “<i>There has been no further movement with regards to Foodari as all legal resources and planning enforcement has been engaged with a two week Appeal Hearing to block a large development.</i>”○ It was reported to ABC that during w/c 29th January 2018 30 lorries were <u>seen</u> to visit the site. ○ The Woodyard, Pound Lane. The developers have requested a meeting with MPC. MPC considered uses of the plot, and decided that their preference was for it to remain as a rural business site.○ The response to the developers email is to be “We are not looking to have a discussion with the developers at this time”.○ Puddleduck Farm – there has been a report of a possible breach of planning conditions at the farm.
