<p>1. Minutes The minutes of the last meeting were read and agreed.</p>	
<p>2. Matters arising Forester Sub-committee – JP has emailed Challock PC to ascertain the protocol for collecting the Foresters as G Jenkins has now retired from this role. A reconciliation of the finances for the early years of the joint venture has not yet been received from Challock PC. Puddleduck Farm – A email has been sent to ABC stating that this is no longer a duck egg farm and asking if this constitutes a breach of planning regulations. Celebration of 100yrs since the end of World War 1 – a sample of the small acrylic soldier has been ordered. Annual Parish Meeting – Invitations have gone out to local groups etc requesting their attendance to update us on the previous year.</p>	
<p>3. Planning – The Woodyard – A flyer has been distributed around the village concerning the possible future uses of the site, including residential, commercial storage and siting of caravans. This was not instigated by MPC, but no originator details were on it. Blueprint Properties have invited the village to a public meeting on 19th April in the village hall. SD advised that Blueprint should be invited to our next MPC meeting (10th May). Foodari – SD had nothing new to report.</p>

There was a suggestion of a speed limit reduction campaign. Details are to be sought on the three recent major accidents on the A252.
